You sin when a love for God is replaced by some "pretend god" (an idol).

1 John 2:16 For all that is in the world—the desires of the flesh and the desires of the eyes and pride of life—is not from the Father but is from the world. 17 And the world is passing away along with its desires, but whoever does the will of God abides forever.

A. The Desires of the - The desire to do The lust of the flesh tempts you toward pleasure. It tells you that life will work only when you can experience whatever you want or escape what you are experiencing right now.

B. The Desires of the - the desire to have The lust of the eyes tempts you toward possessions. It tells you that life will work only when you have stuff that says "good thing" about you.

C. The Pride of the desire to be
The pride of life tempts you toward power . It assures you
that life will work only when people give you your "proper
place" or recognize your "deserved position."
IV. Everybody must SomeOne.
There is a reason you do what you do. There is a reason you
say what you say. It is because you worship what you
worship. "This is worth it!" There is a reason you don't do
what you don't do. There is a reason you don't say what you
don't say. "It's not worth it!" It boils down to what you truly
believe. What do you truly believe about God, His Word, and
yourself?
A. Do not be by your desires.
When you truly believe that something is good, you worship
it. You say, "It's worth it!" You must believe that ${\bf God}$ is ${\bf good.}$
James 1:14-18 14 But each person is tempted when he is lured and
enticed by his own desire. 15 Then desire when it has conceived gives
birth to sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings forth death. 16 Do not be
deceived, my beloved brothers. 17 Every good gift and every perfect gift
is from above, coming down from the Father of lights with whom there is
no variation or shadow due to change.
B. Be renewed in your
When you truly believe that God is good because of Christ's
death on the cross, you lose your desire for sin.
Col. 3:1 If then you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are
above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. 2 Set your minds
on things that are above, not on things that are on earth. 3 For you have
died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. 4 When Christ who is
your[a] life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory.
C. Be by the truth.
2 Cor. 3:18 And we all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the
Lord, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another. For this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit.
